Student safety with online use and access to the internet is extremely important and will be closely monitored on a regular basis.

## **ELECTRONIC DEVICES:**

Students may only use approved websites while in school that are approved by staff before using. Students will keep a list of usernames and passwords in their assigned folders for school and home use.

Students may use their district-issued Chromebook to use outside of school, if necessary to complete work or attend school via Zoom. If a Chromebook is taken home, they must take care of equipment and return in good condition. If it is damaged, parents are responsible for replacing the computer as per signed permission form during school registration.

Students may not have personal electronic devices in school, including mobile telephones, tablets, smartwatches, or laptop computers. The only time these items are allowed would be under special circumstances.

## **DIGITAL CITIZENSHIP IN THE CLASSROOM:**

Students will be presented with digital citizenship lessons in the classroom from [Southwest Educational Development Center](#) (SEDC), [SkillStruck](#).

Students will also have licenses to [Keyboarding Without Tears](#) to use regularly in the classroom. This a web-based curriculum that teaches typing/general computer readiness and features a digital citizenship curriculum from Common Sense Education. The lessons are interactive and self paced.
